Artifact Spotlight

When Marcella Schumacher attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison in the 1930s, she belonged to the International Club. She held lawn parties for them on the farm which included food, drink, and games like croquet - read about us bringing back this tradition in a couple slides!

An ice cream scoop similar to this one could have been used to dish up homemade ice cream. This was the first mechanical ice cream scoop in the U.S and allowed users to measure out consistent ice cream portions and serve them in an attractive way. The heart shaped key at the top is turned which moved a scraper around the inside of the cone to release the ice cream. This ice cream scoop was donated by Leona Grubb of Waunakee.
